

**Assistant professor in Immunology
(NB deadline February 4th, 2016!)**

At Aalborg University, The Department of Health Science and Technology, a 3-year position as assistant professor in Immunology is open for appointment from July 1st, 2016 or soon thereafter.

The position will be affiliated with the Laboratory of Immunology, the research of which is focused on how the adaptive immune system is controlled by the system of dendritic cells. Both basic research and more clinically oriented research is carried out. A specific focus is the development of a new generation of vaccines that target dendritic cells *in situ*. Previous research in the lab has shown that targeting antigen to dendritic cells may induce much stronger immune responses than ordinary, non-targeted antigen. We now wish to evaluate the potential of this approach in infectious diseases, cancer and autoimmunity.

The laboratory has a broad network, nationally and internationally.

The applicant must have a track record of research within immunology or an adjacent area and be willing to participate actively in research within the research field of the Laboratory of Immunology.

The assistant professor will have to teach, primarily on the study programs of medicine and medicine with industrial specialization.

In the coming years Aalborg University Hospital will move from central Aalborg to new buildings adjacent to the university. This will increase the collaboration between the university and the hospital. This collaboration has already started with the establishment of a common, new, state-of-the art facility for experiments on rodents, that will open in the building next to the Laboratory of Immunology in March 2016.

The Medical Faculty at Aalborg University is young and still expanding. The chances of getting a permanent, tenured position as associate professor after 3 years is very good.

Lab facilities are great, cell sorter, new flow cytometers, confocal microscope, mass spectrometry, immunoproteomics, new animal facility etc. Northern Jutland is beautiful, lots of varied nature, North Sea beaches can be reached in about half an hour, houses are cheap, the schools are good.
